SETTING THE SCENE

EMERGING from Camden Town station, you immediately sense the buzz in the air. For this is a lively, edgy area, where something seems to be happening 24/7 and at weekends, the market - London's largest - is thronging with tourists. Away from the stalls, bars and clubs, Camden

offers oodles of green space and relaxing strolls along Regent's Canal, though be prepared to dodge the stream of cyclists. In addition, there are some good schools, while the West End and King's Cross district are both within walking distance.

WHAT'S NEW

Carlow House is a refurbished 1930s Art Deco warehouse that has been transformed into stylish, loft-style apartments. The building's glazed central atrium, which rises up to the fourth floor, overflows with exotic plants and is London's largest winter garden. Only five one and two-bed homes remain, starting at £699,000, from Galliard Homes.
